

OUR HISTORY



The faith sector in Sandwell played an instrumental role during the pandemic - from strengthening community engagement to changing perceptions. Faith leaders and volunteers mobilised swiftly to fill critical gaps while public services were under immense pressure.

The Pandemic

Our Churches, Mosques, Gurdwaras and Temples stepped up, leading the way in delivering food parcels, serving hot meals, and tackling isolation and loneliness by moving activities online. Many places of worship became vaccination centres, enabling rapid outreach to protect the most vulnerable in our communities.

Formation of SFSN

Public Health Sandwell recognised the strong communities within the borough, particularly their ability to engage a large part of the population.

Sandwell Public Health was able to see the leadership and collaboration within these communities. This understanding led to the creation of the Sandwell Faith sector Network, designed to bring faith communities together to share learning, collaborate on local priorities, and help shape inclusive approaches to community wellbeing.

MISSION


- Provide a platform for the faith sector to have a strong, united voice in guiding decision-making.
